

Small Trees: Smaller trees are preferred for planting in parkways under this program to minimize the potential for root damage to adjacent sidewalks and streets.

Medium Trees: Due to the potential of damage to streets and sidewalks from the roots of larger trees, only the following medium-height trees which typically reach a mature height of 40' or less will be approved for reimbursement under this program.

Medium to Large Trees: The following trees **not** approved for planting in the parkway under this program due to potential size are excellent yard trees which homeowners may wish to consider for planting elsewhere in their yards.

Trees that may NOT be Planted in parkways regardless of mature height:

Some trees not approved for planting in the parkway are excellent yard trees, but are not suitable for street tree use because of an abundance of fruit which may litter streets or clog sewer inlets, or, as in the case of evergreens, because they may present visibility problems.
